As Christmas is not too far away and children will be thinking of writing their letters to Santa soon, I wanted to make you aware of a small change we will be making in school after Christmas.

After Christmas, we will only be allowing pencil cases in Year 5 and 6. This is because, similar to fidgets, these can become a real distraction for pupils in the younger year groups. Children can become fixated on the exciting draws, rubbers and pencil sharpeners that they can magically make appear out of the modern pencil cases. 
We hope that this advanced noticed helps Santa to plan effectively!


FOOTBALL REPORT


SUPERSTAR CORNER CONTINUED
